3. Collaboration – KVRI support hours = 216
4. Highlights from the FY2020 report:
 - a. NEPA –
 - i. Continued collaboration on the Westside Restoration Project
 - b. Timber –
 - i. Volume Sold in timber sales = 10.2 Mmbf
 - ii. Boulder Dash – 4.7 Mmbf and Robin Hood – 5.5 Mmbf
 - iii. Volume Harvested = 13 mmbf (Approx 2600 log truck loads)
 - iv. Acres treated by timber sales = 591
 - v. Volume remaining under contract ~40MMBF
 - c. Fuels –
 - i. Fuels acres treated = 1,824 acres
 - ii. Perkins Lake Fire started in a harvest unit where piles were burned
 - iii. Boundary County FireSafe was able to get grant dollars to reduce fuels on many private land parcels adjacent to the Deer Creek Project
 - d. Reforestation - Acres Planted = 761
 - e. Total Acres Treated on Landscape = 9,310
 - f. Miles of road maintained or improved = 172
 - g. Miles of trails maintained or improved = 115
 - h. BMUs maintained to standard
 - i. Grouse BMU – 3.24 miles stored in Boundary County
 - i. Jobs Supported/Maintained
